Welcome to ULVERSTON

Our fascinating South Lakeland town is just a few miles from the shores of Lake Windermere. Colourful festivals combined with an assortment of independent shops, cosy pubs, traditional markets, cultural events, historic town trails and a warm welcome, all add up to a unique visitor experience.

Where to shop

In 1280, Edward I granted Ulverston a charter to hold "a market on Thursday each week and every year a fair lasting three days". This tradition still holds and each Thursday, on the cobbled streets of Market Place and New Market Street, you can find a number of quality market stalls. In addition to this, there is an indoor Market Hall 1 (closed Wed & Sun) offering artisan breads & cakes, delicatessen fare, gifts, handicrafts, local history books, clothing and much, much more, providing visitors with an exceptional shopping experience. Ulverston's unique selling point is its remarkable abundance of independent specialist retailers selling exclusive gifts, fashion and food. Please note that Wednesday is half-day closing.

Where to eat

Hungry? Choose one of Ulverston's numerous town centre eateries. You can relax and enjoy anything from morning coffee, substantial pub lunch, homemade cakes and award-winning tea. Vegetarian and vegan diets are well catered for, as is the taste for fine food from around the world. Ulverston has a wide selection of pubs, wine bars and craft beer outlets. We also have our own brewery - The Ulverston Brewing Company, who welcome pre-arranged visits.

What to see

Ulverston is an historic town with a story to tell. In the 18th Century it was a manufacturing town of some importance, the fast-flowing Gill Beck providing power for mills making cotton, paper and candles as well as supplying water for the many leather tanneries dotted about the town. The link to craftsmanship still exists today with **Cumbria Crystal** 2, the UK's last fully working luxury crystal factory, where you can watch the blowing & cutting of exquisite crystal glassware.

By the 19th Century, Ulverston was a busy commercial port with a thriving ship building industry. **Ulverston Canal** is a legacy of that industry. It is the deepest, widest, shortest canal in England at just 1 1/4 miles (2km) long. There is an easy and accessible walk down the towpath from **Canal Head** 3 to the Bay Horse at **Canal Foot** 4 where delicious coffee and shortbread is served. This freshwater canal, is a haven

for wildlife, here swans, many breeds of water fowl and even otters can be spotted.

Back in the town centre, spend a moment or two at the **War Memorial** 5 honouring Ulverstonians who served in both World Wars, including three recipients of the Victoria Cross. Move on to **St Mary's Church** 6. Built in 1111, this Parish Church is a great example of workmanship through the ages. Although rebuilt in Victorian times the Norman arch over the inner door and the Tudor tower at the west end stand testament to its early origins. For a more recent example of craftsmanship, head over to the Gill for the stunning **Cumbria Way Marker** 7. This marks the start of the Cumbria Way, a 70 mile (112km) walk that runs through the central Lakes and finishes in Carlisle.

Ulverston celebrates a number of prominent former residents. The unmissable memorial on the top of Hoad Hill is the **Sir John Barrow Monument** 8. Built in 1850 in honour of Sir John Barrow. Born 1764 at Dragley Beck in what is now known as **Sir John Barrow Cottage** 9 (open from Easter Fri 11am-4pm & Sun, 1-5pm until the end of October) he went on to become a noted explorer and one of the founders of The Geographical Society. In 1804 he became Second Secretary to the Admiralty until his death 40 years later. The uphill climb is well rewarded by breath-taking views over Morecambe Bay and the Lake District Fells. Access is via several footpaths from Ulverston town centre and is open to the public on Sundays and Bank Holiday Mondays from 1-5pm, Easter to the end of October, whenever the flag on the hill is flying. Within walking distance from the town centre, **Swarthmoor Hall** 10 (an Elizabethan manor house), became the centre of the developing Quaker movement when its founder George Fox made the Hall his base from 1652 to 1654. House, garden and café are open to the public. swarthmoorhall.co.uk

The town's most famous son, legendary comedian **Stan Laurel**, was born in Argyle Street 11 in 1890 and was later christened Arthur Stanley Jefferson in Ulverston Parish Church. A bronze statue 12 immortalising the comedy genius of Laurel and Hardy stands at the front of the Coronation Hall, commissioned and paid for by The Sons of the Desert and presented as a gift to the town in 2009. The **Laurel & Hardy Museum** 15, a treasure trove of memorabilia, can be found in Brogden Street, behind the Coronation Hall, in the Roxy building. With classic Laurel & Hardy films showing all day in the cosy cinema, it is a treat no to be missed. laurel-and-hardy.co.uk

Entertainment

One of the principal buildings in town is the **Coronation Hall** 13. Affectionately known as 'The Coro' it first opened in 1918 having been commissioned by the Town council to commemorate the coronation of King George V. Today, it offers a diverse programme of entertainment - from popular music and local amateur dramatics to world class ballet and

opera. thecoro.co.uk The building is also the temporary home of Ulverston Library. Behind The Coro is the **Roxy** 14, a traditional Art Deco cinema showing current releases, classic and art house movies. ulverston.nm-cinemas.co.uk

Ulverston also boasts a **Leisure Centre** 16 offering a 25m swimming pool, gym facility, Cumbria's largest tennis centre & more. better.org.uk

Exploring the outskirts

Whilst surrounded by countryside, there is lots of greenery to be found close to town centre. Gill Banks offers a leafy stroll beside fast running water and **Ford Park** 17, a couple of minutes' walk from the town centre, is a community run park with restaurant, walled kitchen garden, adventure playground, trails, and a programme of cultural events and family activities. It also hosts a Park Run every Saturday and offers access to the Hoad Hill. ford-park.org.uk

Also worth a diversion from the town centre is **Conishead Priory** 18. Home to one of the largest Buddhist communities in Europe, the Buddhist temple and historic mansion are set in 70 acres of woodlands and parkland right next to Morecambe Bay. manjushri.org

If you are feeling a bit more adventurous, head for **Birkrigg Common** 19. Its bracken-covered and sheep-grazed limestone upland, is home to the remains of ancient settlements, tumuli and a double stone circle known as the Druid's Temple. You are also rewarded with panoramic views of Morecambe Bay and the Lake District Fells.

Free Guided Walks

There are a series of free, guided walking leaflets, to help visitors explore not just the history of the town but also the wonderful countryside and historic landmarks on the outskirts. They are available from Booths supermarket 2, the Market Hall 1 and from a number of retailers, cafés and pubs around town.

To learn more of Ulverston's absorbing history, pick up a copy of 'Stan's Ulverston Town Trail' and experience the town as Ulverston's most famous son, Stan Laurel would have known it. Or explore further afield with 'Six gentle walks around Ulverston' each starting from the Coronation Hall, encompassing sites such as Swarthmoor Hall and Ford Park. For the more energetic, 'A tour of Ulverston from coast to hills' is the leaflet for you. Alternatively, you can simply wander the town's streets which still retain many fine Georgian and Victorian buildings, and seek out the blue plaques telling their history.

The town website chooseulverston.co.uk also offers several trails which take you around the quirky, cobbled streets and ginnels of the town, helping you discover dog friendly shops and eateries, as well as child orientated activities.
